Candidates (in alphabetical order)

<u>Robert D. Brown</u> – Rob is Professor of Classics at Vassar College. He plays the organ for his own enjoyment and is frequently working behind the scenes at concerts in Vassar college venues. He has been a member of our chapter for the past several years and served on the Grants committee for the 2005 Convention.

<u>Greg Citarella</u> – Greg is presently Director of Music/Organist at St. Nicholas on the Hudson in New Hamburg. He has held positions at Holy Cross Episcopal Church in Kingston from 1980 to 1994 and then St. James Episcopal from 1995- 2000. Gregory is also a member of the Association of Anglican Musicians. During the week he works in procurement at IBM.

<u>Nancy Demilio-Scott</u> – Nancy is an organist and vocalist. Currently she serves as Organist at the Beacon Reformed Church. She and her husband Kevin live in Middletown.

<u>Charles Faverio, MD</u> – Charles has a long association with AGO chapters in the Central Hudson Valley, New York City, and Monmouth, NJ, where he was Sub-Dean and chapter historian. He has sung in church choirs and is Associate Director of Monmouth Musica, an organization dedicated to early American Music. He is currently employed by St. Francis Hospital in Poughkeepsie as an Occupational Health Physician with board certification in Internal Medicine and Occupational (Preventative) Medicine.

<u>Nancy Harle</u> – Nancy holds a Master of Arts in Teaching from Manhattanville College in New York and a Bachelor of Arts in Teaching from Auburn University in Alabama. She has studied and performed extensively as a pianist, organist, and singer. For 25 years she has taught music and directed choruses in public and parochial schools, as well as in her private studio. She is currently Organist/Cantor at both Laydentown United Methodist Church and Viola United Methodist Church.
