#### ORGANIST/CHOIR DIRECTOR - (Part-Time) RHINEBECK REFORMED CHURCH - RHINEBECK, NY

The Rhinebeck Reformed Church, a 278-year-old congregation affiliated with the Reformed Church in America, is looking for an organist and/or choir director to collaborate in the leading of worship and to provide musical leadership to approximately 10 adult singers, whose musical background and gifts vary. The ideal candidate must have proficiency in both organ and piano, and should possess experience in leading vocalists. Also, the ideal candidate should have excellent interpersonal, leadership and communication skills across intergenerational lines and musical genres, given that we have a demographically diverse congregation and a blended service. The organ is a fine historic 2-manual, 10-rank tracker instrument built by Frank Roosevelt in 1894; it is original to the building and has been well maintained. The key action is pneumatic. Choir rehearsals take place on Thursdays, from 7 to 8:30 PM, and there is a brief rehearsal prior to worship on Sundays. Other responsibilities will include working with the junior choir and playing, as needed, on Ash Wednesday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday Christmas Eve services. Salary is \$12,000 - \$13,000 and predicated on scope of experience, skill sets and responsibilities assumed.
