Letter from the Dean

Dear Colleagues,

Did you know that a church festival was a time for a similar prediction? Those of you familiar with medieval liturgy may remember February 2^{nd} was known as Candlemas. This was a festival to celebrate the presentation of Jesus in the Temple where he was greeted by Anna and Simeon. Simeon talks about Jesus being the "light to enlighten the nations" so this

Many of us have heard him play either at St. John's Lutheran in Poughkeepsie or other local venues so we know he really deserves it.

Our March meeting is the Meredith Baker recital and we have nothing scheduled in April since most of us will be very busy with Holy Week and Easter. But don't forget to be planning for the May Members Recital on the 22nd. It will be here before you know it so start practicing!

Since both the Candlemas saying and the ground hog agree, let's hope for an early spring.

INTERIM ORGANIST

ST. AEDAN'S RC CHURCH - PEARL RIVER, NY

St. Aedan's is seeking an interim organist for March and April. The specifics of the position are as follows:

1) Playing at the 9:30, 11:00 and 12:30 AM Masses on Sunday

2) Playing at the Wednesday evening adult choir rehearsal from 7:30-9:00PM

3) Playing for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil on April 21-23

4) Playing for two confirmation services April 30.

No need for weddings, funerals or other liturgies at this time.

St. Aedan's has a three manual Allen Electronic which in the right hands and feet can sound like a pipe organ. I do not know the number of ranks, but it is a fine instrument installed around 8 years ago. There are also MIDI instrument cards for that kind of use if desired.

Salary is experience based, negotiated through the pastor and Interim DMM. St. Aedan's doesn't conform with AGO guidelines. Extra compensation for the Triduum and for the confirmation services.

<u>St. Aedan's</u> is located at 23 Reld Drive, Pearl River, NY 10965. The church is a typical suburban Roman Catholic parish with smaller than expected participation (1,000 families, but only 10 in adult and 10 in youth choir). Most of the people are friendly and the Interim DDM is well liked and respected by all.

We will be listening to candidates next week (Feb 22-25). Please contact us for a time to play, and have available a solo piece, several hymns and service music you are familiar with.
