Dear Colleagues,

We had a wonderful start to the fall season with our organ crawl in Kingston. Thanks to our host organists: Lonnie Kulick, Terry Earles, Jean Hattersley and James Fitzwilliam. Also many thanks to Eric Hepp for arranging this. We got to play (or listen to) four very different organs as well as have lunch with our colleagues. Great fun!

Our next event is a big one: Evensong at West Point on October 24. Craig Williams will start us off at 2:30 with a 30-minute organ recital. The Evensong is in honor of the Protestant Reformation which began in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church

door in Wittemberg. Luther's most famous hymn, *A Mighty Fortress is our God*, will be sung by the congregation. It is also the basis for the Bach Cantata (*Ein feste Burg*) which will be sung by area church choirs during the Evensong. They will be accompanied by oboe and a string quintet. We will also sing a Psalm based on that hymn and text. Other music includes some chants and the final blessing as set by Peter Lutkin.

If your church choir would like to participate you need to contact Laura Russell (LRUSSELL@hvc.rr.com) immediately. If she already knows you are participating, please contact her to let her know how many singers will be coming from your group.

If your choir is not participating as singers please encourage them and others in your church to come and be part of the worshipping congregation.

Looking ahead please put November 13 on your calendar. Gail Archer, internationally known concert artist and Vassar chapel organist, will be giving us a workshop. Look for more details about time and place in our next newsletter.

Sunday, October 24, 2010 2:30 PM	Organ Recital and Choral Evensong (Ecumenical) An organ recital by Craig S. Williams , current USMA Organist/Choirmaster, will precede a service of Choral Evensong at 3:00 PM. This service commemorates the Protestant Reformation, which many hold to have begun on October 31, 1517, when Martin Luther is reputed to have posted his 95 Theses on the gate of the Castle Church in Wittenburg. During this Evensong service, Luther's most famous hymn "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" will be sung by the congregation, and Johann Sebastian Bach's famous Cantata 80 based on that same hymn in the original German ("Ein feste Burg") will be performed in its entirety throughout the service. Music will be provided by combined Hudson Valley church and community choirs and chamber orchestra, conducted by Dr. Laura R. Russell . Combined with these forces will be the Cadet Chapel's famous pipe organ played by Mr. Williams. The chapel organ contains over 23,500 pipes in a splendid cathedral sanctuary and is the world's largest all- pipe organ found in a house of worship. This organ is heard by literally thousands of visitors every year including heads of state, members of Congress, cabinet members and foreign dignitaries. Location: Cadet Chapel, USMA, West Point, NY. Saturday, October 30, 2010 1:00 PM	Organ Tour in Amenia, NY "Musical and Architectural Treasures in Amenia" - The Town of Amenia is unique in that it possesses four historic 19th century pipe organs in virtually original condition. This direct contact with the past is considered invaluable to musicians and historians alike. In most parts of the country the sounds and sights of these instruments have long been lost to modern "improvements". These fascinating instruments and the distinctive structures that house them will be the focus of a mini-concert tour sponsored by the Amenia Historical Society. The tour begins at 1:00 PM, with approximately twenty minutes at each stop. Included will be two Jardine organs that were precursors to the original grand organ built for the new St. Patrick's Cathedral in 1879, as well as a fully-restored Robjohn organ from 1860 and a re-purposed and newly-installed 117-year old Johnson & Sons organ. Will Carter, noted organist and past Dean of the American Guild of Organists in New York City will demonstrate the organs. Buildings included are St. Thomas Episcopal Church, which shares both an original architect and a recent history with Trinity Church, Wall Street; United Presbyterian with its striking composition of three buildings and a remarkable Tiffany window; Immaculate Conception with exquisite glass and an original communion set; and Smithfield Church, a perfectly proportioned Greek temple set on a small stone hill. With degrees from Westminster Choir College and Union Seminary School of Sacred Music, Lee Dettra holds also the FAGO and ChM diplomas.
